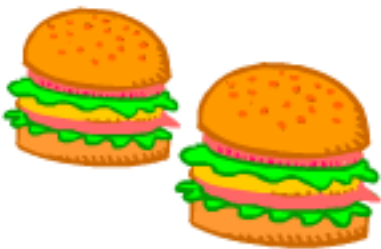


COUNTABLE NOUNS

They name anything
that we can count.



Here are some countable nouns.



two hamburgers



three cookies



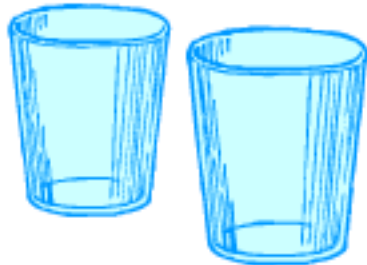
one lollipop



three eggs



one cup



two glasses



one mug



four spoons

Countable nouns can be singular or plural.



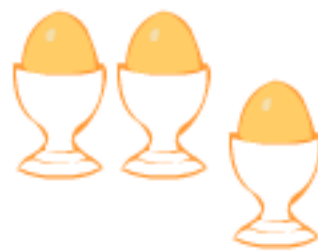
a lollipop



my egg



lollipops



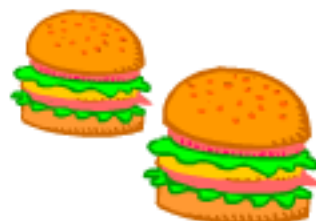
your eggs



one hamburger



the mug



two hamburgers



the mugs

When a countable noun is singular,
we must use a word like **a / an, the,**
my, one before it.

When a countable noun is plural,
we can use it alone.

Use *how many* to ask questions with countable nouns.

How many butterflies can you see?
Ten butterflies. A lot.

How many flowers can you see?
Not many flowers. Only two.
